YP Wong, Deputy Head of the IP Investigation Bureau (IPIB), Hong Kong Customs



YP Wong has been with Hong Kong Customs as an Inspector since 1988. He was attached to the Office of Information Technology (OIT) of Hong Kong Customs for 10 years after serving as an investigator in dealing with international smuggling activities. During his time at OIT, he was responsible for running the Forensic Laboratory and the Computer Analysis and Response Team (CART) of Hong Kong Customs. He received computer forensic training in the USA and Hong Kong and he is currently the Deputy Head of the Intellectual Property Investigation Bureau (IPIB) of Hong Kong Customs. He is currently in charge of the Electronic Crime Investigation Centre (ECIC) which is tasked to conduct research on various electronic crimes and provide IT training to enforcement officers in relation with IPR related cybercrimes.

Louise Ho, Head of Intellectual Property Investigation Bureau, Hong Kong Customs



Ms Ho has joined the Hong Kong Customs for more than 20 years. She is now the Head of the Intellectual Property Investigation Bureau, who oversees and controls the investigative and operational activities of the Bureau, including initiation and formulation of policies and strategies for better effectiveness and efficiency in the work. Prior to joining the Bureau, she was the overall commander of the Rail and Ferry Command which performs enforcement and control duties of cross-boundary passengers at the six rail and ferry control points across the territory.

Ms Ho spent most of her career life in drug investigation and financial investigation. She holds a Master Degree in Public Administration.

Eben Roberts, Deputy Attaché, DHS/ICE Homeland Security Investigations

Mr. Eben Roberts is the U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE), Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) Deputy Attaché in Hong Kong, with regional responsibility for Hong Kong, Taiwan, and Macau. HSI Hong Kong investigates a wide range of crimes, including counter-proliferation networks, commercial fraud, intellectual property rights (IPR) violations, money laundering, human smuggling and trafficking, child exploitation, and international narcotics trafficking.

Prior to joining the HSI Hong Kong team, Mr. Roberts held various roles in HSI headquarters and served as an ICE Fellow on Capitol Hill where he investigated government waste, fraud and abuse. Before arriving at headquarters in 2008, Mr. Roberts worked at the HSI New York office as a member of the El Dorado Task Force, a multi-agency ICE-led organization targeting money laundering in the New York area. While there, Mr. Roberts specialized in money laundering and worked an array of complex financial investigations linked to organized crime; telemarketing, bank, wire, and benefit fraud; and narcotics trafficking. Mr. Roberts holds Bachelor's degrees in Economics and Accounting from the College of William and Mary. He also holds a Master of Science (MS) in Criminal Justice from American University and a Master of Business Administration (MBA) from the Kellogg School of Management at Northwestern University.







Stanislas Barro, Senior Brand Protection Manager Kering Asia Pacific Limited



Stanislas joined Kering Asia Pacific in 2012 as Group Senior Brand Protection manager. He is based in Hong Kong and oversees the intellectual property and brand protection activities of the Luxury and Sport & Lifestyle divisions of the group in the Asia pacific region. Kering has a portfolio of over 20 brands such as Gucci, Bottega Veneta, Saint Laurent, Balenciaga and Puma.
